Rudston's Recipes

Date and Apple Squares

Ingredients

225g butter
140g cooking apple (peeled, cored and chopped)
140g stoned date, chopped
280g light soft brown sugar
175g plain flour
1tsp bicarbonate of soda
100g porridge oats

Method

Heat over to 190C/170C fan oven/gas mark 5
Grease an 18cm tin and line with baking parchment
Tip the apples into a pan with 2tbsp of water, bring to boil and simmer on a low heat for 5min until tender and slightly pulpy (I do this in the microwave)
Add the dates and 50g of sugar and cook for a further 5 minutes
Take off the heat and break the apples down with the back of a spoon until smooth and mix well with the dates, set aside
Gently melt the butter in a saucepan/microwave
Mix the flour, bicarbonate, oats and remaining sugar in a bowl
Pour in the melted butter and stir well until oats are coated
Press half the mixture firmly into the tin
Spread the apple mix on top and smooth over
Cover with the remaining oat mixture and press down.
Bake for 30-35min until golden and firm
Cool completely in the tin and cut into squares
