This month we look at how the Rudston community realised its vision by re-opening the Bosville Arms as East Yorkshire's first community pub.

During 2019 and 2020, the community came together to renovate and refurbish the historic pub building. The developments were funded by a combination of grants such as the Plunkett Foundation, Lisset Wind Farm Community Fund, YOR4Good, and the 'Pub is the Hub'. A community share offer, resulting in 144 shareholders, brought in the remainder of the necessary funding. The grant from the 'Pub is the Hub' facilitated the building and furnishing of the coffee shop.

Through tireless work by community volunteers, the building and accommodation block was transformed from being almost derelict to the modern and welcoming place it is today. In January 2021 Martin and Sharon Hincks were appointed as tenants and, along with their team of local staff, are responsible for the day-to-day management of the pub.

Since late 2021 and into early 2022, as Covid restrictions slowly lifted, a program of community events organised by the Share Holders Events Sub-Committee and hosted by the Bosville have taken place. The events include the monthly Ladies Night, Midweek Men, and the Community Plant In, funded by the East Riding of Yorkshire Community Tree Planting Fund. Most recently, the Bubbly and Birthday Cake celebration was attended by over 140 people, funded by the Do It for East Yorkshire Community Grant.

We look forward to welcoming you to more community events during autumn and winter. In the meantime, we wish Sharon, Martin, and the team continued success.





KIDS

According to today's regulators and bureaucrats, those of us who were kids in the 30's, 40's, 50's, 60's, 70's or early 80's, probably shouldn't have survived.

We would leave home in the morning and play all day, as long as we were back when the street lights came on. No one was able to reach us all day. No mobile phones.

Unthinkable!

We did not have Playstations, Nintendo 64, X-Boxes, no video games, no 99 channels on cable, Netflix, surround sound, mobile phones, tablets or internet chat rooms.

We had friends! We went outside and found them.

We fell out of trees, got cut and broke bones and teeth, and there were no lawsuits from these accidents. They were accidents. No one was to blame but us.

Remember accidents?!

We had flights and punched each other and got black and blue and learned to get over it.

We made up games with sticks and tennis balls and, although we were told it would happen, we did not put out any eyes.

We rode bikes or walked to a friend's home and knocked on the door, or rang the bell, or just walked in and talked to them.

Our actions were our own. Consequences were expected. The idea of parents bailing us out if we broke the law was unheard of. They actually sided with the school or the law. Imagine that!

This generation has produced some of the best risk takers, problem solvers and inventors, ever.

We had freedom, failure, success, and responsibility.....and learned how to deal with


And you're one of them! Congratulations.




