

ALL SAINTS CHURCH, RUDSTON, SOCIAL COMMITTEE

We look forward to our next event on Sunday September 11th at 2.30pm in Church when we are fortunate to have the renowned Organ recitalist Anthony Burns-Cox coming to play the organ for us. He has prepared an interesting programme to put the organ through its paces and show it at its best. There will be 2 favourite hymns to join in with. He has entitled his recital as:

" AN ALL-ORGANIC MUSICAL MENU"

It will last about an hour and we will serve tea and cake to finish off the afternoon.

Tickets for this are £5 each to include tea and cake and we hope for a full Church to hear the organ played professionally (similar concerts locally cost £10 to £15). We need to sell tickets in advance for catering purposes but tickets will also be sold on the day on the door. Tickets can be reserved and bought from Jean Corner on 01262 420 622 and Margaret Reed on 01262 420 648.

This is an opportunity not to be missed. The organ has an interesting history and was the first organ in the country, other than in London, to be powered by electricity funded by Sir Alexander Macdonald who was the organist at that time and who formed a village Church Choir. The stained-glass window above the organ depicts him playing the organ with the choir around him.

Watch out for any "POP UP OPEN GARDEN WITH TEA AND CAKE" signs during the months of July and August. Nothing is fixed but there may be an opportunity for a last-minute decision to open a garden or two around the village in aid of Church funds. A board will appear on the side of the road to inform you if this occurs.

RUDSTON COMMUNITY PUB

This month, we continue to celebrate how Rudston community realised its vision of owning a community enterprise by re-opening the Bosville Arms as East Yorkshire's first community pub.



After a monumental effort by community volunteers to renovate and refurbish the building in readiness for opening to the public, the hanging of the pub sign marked the completion of the first stage of the project. The Bosville Arms hanging sign presented to the pub by Somerled Macdonald in October 2020, incorporates the Bosville/Macdonald family crest. British pub signs were created in the 12th century and were simple representations of tankards, hops, and other brewing-related equipment. The signs were designed to inform passers-by that the establishments sold ale.

The static sign above the door, added in July 2021, was the final touch to the building. The sign matches a photograph taken at the start of the century when a pub was known as a "Peoples Refreshment House".






Logic problem

- 3. The Hyundai was done before the brakes but after the blue car






Draw a single continuous line around the grid that passes through all the circles. The line must enter and leave each box in the centre of one of its four sides.

Rudston's Recipes

CHEESE STRAWS Ingredients

100 g Self Raising Flour Pinch salt Pinch mustard 50g margarine or butter 75g grated hard cheese 1 egg

Method

- Sieve flour, salt and mustard. Rub in margarine or butter
- Mix in cheese, add enough egg to make a stiff dough
- Roll out thinly and cut into strips or rings
- Bake in a pre-heated oven (180 degrees/gas mark 4) for 10-15 minutes

MIXED FRUIT BRÛLÉES Ingredients

450g/1 lb prepared assorted summer fruits (mix of strawberries, raspberries, blackcurrents, redcurrents & cherries), thawed if frozen 150ml/5f l oz half-fat double cream alternative (Elmlea) 150ml/ 5 fl oz low fat natural yoghurt/fromage frais (unsweetened) 1 tsp vanilla extract 4 tbsp demerara sugar

Method

- Divide the fruit evenly among 4 ovenproof ramekin dishes
- Mix together all the remaining ingredients, except the demerara sugar
- Evenly spoon the mixture into the ramekin dishes, ensuring the fruit is covered
- · Preheat grill to hot
- Top each ramekin with 1 tbsp demerara sugar
- Place under grill for 2-3 minutes until the sugar melts and begins to caramelise
- Leave to stand for a couple of minutes before serving






