

We are looking for new committee members so if you would like to get involved, please contact me.



Set's get Cooking!

Rudston's Recipes

WIMBLEDON SALAD

Ingredients FOR THE DRESSING

1 garlic clove, crushed 2 tbsp Pimm's 2 tbsp olive oil 1 tbsp runny honey Juice of ½ orange

FOR THE SALAD

20 g strawberries, hulled 125g cherry tomatoes, halved ½ medium cucumber, halved lengthways and chopped 2 spring onions, finely sliced

125g rocket

100g firm goat's cheese (with rind)

Method

• For the dressing, whisk all the ingredients in a large, shallow serving bowl with plenty of seasoning.

- For the salad, halve any smaller strawberries and quarter the larger ones. Add to the dressing bowl, with the tomatoes, cucumber, spring onions and rocket. Toss gently to combine.
- Crumble over the goat's cheese. Finish with some extra freshly ground black pepper and serve.

GRILLED STRAWBERRIES

Ingredients

400g strawberries
1 tbsp vanilla sugar*
1 tbsp stem ginger, in syrup
1 splash of Pimm's

4 scoops of quality vanilla ice cream

*Vanilla Sugar

Place 1 vanilla pod in a food processor, blitz, scrape the sides and blitz again. Add 250g caster sugar and blitz for 2 minutes, or until super-fine. Sieve the mixture and store in an airtight container.

Method

- Preheat the grill to high
- Hull the strawberries and toss with the sugar.
- Finely slice the ginger and stir through the strawberries with 2 tablespoons of the gingery syrup. Place in a shallow ovenproof dish.
- Grill the strawberries for a few minutes, until softened and hot, then add the Pimm's and stir to scrape up all the sticky bits from the bottom of the dish.
- Divide the strawberries and juices between four bowls, top with a scoop of ice cream and tuck in.




