



Set's get Cooking!

Rudston's Recipes

LEMON HERB GRILLED CHICKEN

Ingredients

4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
Juice of 2 lemons
Zest of 1 lemon
3 cloves of garlic, minced
2 tbsps fresh herbs (such as thyme, rosemary, or basil), chopped
2 tbsps olive oil
Salt and black pepper to taste

Method

- In a bowl, combine the lemon juice, lemon zest, minced garlic, chopped herbs, olive oil, salt and black pepper.
- Place the chicken breasts in a shallow dish and pour the marinade over them, ensuring they are evenly coated.
- Cover the dish and refrigerate for at least 1 hour (or overnight) to marinate.
- Preheat your grill to medium heat.
- Remove the chicken from the marinade and discard any excess.
- Grill the chicken breasts for about 6-7 minutes per side until they are cooked through and reach an internal temperature of 165°F (74°C).
- Remove from the grill and let them rest for a few minutes before serving.
- Slice the grilled chicken and serve with your favourite side dishes.

STRAWBERRY-MANGO SALSA

Ingredients

1 cup strawberries, diced
1 cup mango, diced
1/4 cup red onion, finely chopped

2 tablespoons fresh cilantro, chopped Juice of 1 lime

Salt to taste

1 jalapeño pepper, seeded & finely chopped

Method

- In a bowl, combine the diced strawberries, diced mango, chopped red onion, chopped jalapeño pepper, chopped cilantro, lime juice, and salt.
- Mix well until all the ingredients are combined.
- Adjust the salt and lime juice according to your taste preference.
- Let the salsa sit in the refrigerator for about 15-20 minutes to allow the flavours to meld together.
- Serve the strawberry-mango salsa as a refreshing topping for grilled fish or chicken, or as a dip with tortilla chips.


