Dear Friends,

We have just spent a day away at Wydale Hall, the York Diocesan Retreat House. When I say 'WE' I mean folks from the eight churches of our benefice. It was a great opportunity to spend some quality time together, to listen to two brilliant and inspiring speakers, to enjoy the lovely food and to share some different forms of worship. The theme for the day was 'Let your life speak' and we were encouraged to discuss how our Christian faith impacted on our lives and how we can speak to others about our faith and encourage others to explore faith. We are all disciples of Jesus but so often we forget to announce the fact. Revd Jackie gave us the statement 'I am' and asked us to answer the question. It was amazing that not one of us said I AM 'a disciple of Christ'. I was ashamed to say that I had taken the fact that I am a disciple of Christ as read, but I had not announced it.

# ***The Bosville Arms***

Great news for the village. The planning appeal by the owner of the Bosville has been dismissed. Thank you to all who took the trouble to object, as it showed a high level of community support which was a big factor in the inspectors' decision.

Since the decision, the Rudston Pub group has met and the next step will be to set up a Community Benefit Society. This will be called Rudston Com-



munity Pub Ltd and will be a Community owned company that is able to raise funds ,via a share offer and access grants through the Plunkett Foundations' "More than a pub" programme , in order to raise the necessary funds to make an offer to purchase the pub.

Whilst there is no guarantee that the owner will be willing to sell, the dismissal of the planning appeal has removed the threat of development and keeps the site as a pub.

The Rudston Pub group will be looking to recruit some additional members to assist with the setting up of Rudston Community Pub Ltd, anyone in the Community who is interested in becoming part of this enterprise please email - [cllr.simmonds@rudston.org.uk](mailto:cllr.simmonds@rudston.org.uk)

## **Notice of Casual Vacancy**

Following the recent elections a vacancy has occurred among the members of the Parish Council. Any person willing to fill this vacancy should apply to the Clerk in writing. The applicants name must appear on the current local electoral register or the applicant should have, during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date, resided in or within three miles of the parish or the applicant's only place of work during the whole of the twelve months preceding the relevant date is in the parish. The applicant must not be debarred from standing as a Councillor. Public elections cannot be held again until 2023 but for the interim period election to the aforesaid Council will be voted for by the present sitting number of Councillors.


