Crosslands Column



The time between Summer parish council meetings may have been the “quieter period”, but there were still plenty of items to discuss on the 4th September, when we had our longest session for a while.

There has been no response from Westminster to our letter to Eric Pickles, and nothing further to report on Thornholme. There was just a relatively minor alteration at Denby House, where they had to apply for a re-positioning of one of the two turbines when it was discovered that it would be too near an underground pipeline. That has now been passed, so the second one should be appearing on the horizon any time soon.

On the internet there seem to be petitions continuously for various causes, and some could even be “worthy”! The one you will have been asked to sign by your nearest parish council member we hope is at least that. With grand schemes costing millions taking place in London all the time (mostly involving sporting events or new railways!) you can understand government priorities, but we don’t want them to forget more modest rural needs. We want our “Fair Share”, preferably without having to fight to get it.

Concern was again expressed over the Village Hall. There may be something elsewhere in the newsletter about that, but briefly please try and support the events taking place there. Even when the Bosville is finally up and running again, it is one of the few “village assets” left.

However, before we get too gloomy, the parish council is always open to new ideas which come its way. One of the latest is an “Activities for Older Folk” initiative. Basically, it would be a sort of weekly “fun and games” period for seniors. Though, one of the activities recommended was Indoor Bowls, which we already have of course. Any-

way, one of our members is looking into the possibility of a trial period for Rudston. "Watch this space" as the saying goes.

The audit of accounts has at last been completed, and in a change to previous procedures a photocopy of the main part of the return is (was?) displayed on the Long Street notice board. Anyone wishing to see the full document can apply to myself and I can make individual arrangements. A charge is applicable and the viewing period will end on 11th October.

For those interested in local history, a new book is published this month called "East Yorkshire Village Visits" by Martin Limon, which includes Rudston. Apparently, it is a sequel to "The Villages of East Yorkshire" published two years ago by the same author. In the recent past we would simply have asked in Sokells (Driffield) or Garlands (Bridlington) for these things, but now it is: www.amazon.co.uk.

There is not so long until the next parish council meeting, which is to be on 16th October.

Apricot upside down cake

Ingredients

100g butter

12 apricots, halved and pitted, or 1kg tinned apricots in juice

90g soft light-brown sugar

1 tsp natural vanilla extract

125g plain flour

2 tsp baking powder

1 tsp ground cinnamon

115g caster sugar

130ml soured cream

crème fraîche or whipped cream, to serve

Method

1. Preheat the oven to 200°C/400°F/gas mark 6. Cut 75g of the butter into small pieces and set aside. If you are using tinned apricots, drain them well and pat dry with kitchen paper.

2. In a 24cm (9½in) ovenproof frying-pan, melt the rest of the butter with the brown sugar and vanilla. Cook for one minute, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Remove from the heat and arrange the apricots, cut-side down in the pan.

3. Sift the flour, baking powder and cinnamon together into a bowl and stir in the caster sugar. Add the butter pieces and rub in with the fingertips until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs. Add the soured cream, stirring to combine. Spoon the mixture over the apricots and bake for 30 minutes until golden.

4. Remove the tart from the oven and immediately invert it carefully on to a serving platter. Cut into slices and serve topped with a dollop of crème fraîche or whipped cream

A similar sized dish can be used instead of the ovenproof frying pan
